INSTRUCTIONS TO THE PROCTOR/EVALUATOR

2. PPE should be a minimum of level D
3. The product identification (UN number) will be given to the student at the beginning of the skill. This must be done to allow the candidate to determine how to set up the corridor.
4. The proctor must provide the candidate with the following equipment:
 - a. ***Emergency Response Guide (ERG).***
 - b. ***NIOSH Pocket Guide.***
 - c. ***ICS 201-OS form.***
 - d. Cones, tarp, garden hoses and nozzles, manifold, pools, stools or chairs, buckets, brushes, and 1 ½ - 1¾" fire hose.
