**Skill # 23.2 Decon Level B Liquid Splash Protective Clothing** | Maximum Time Allowed: **15 min.**

### INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CANDIDATE

The candidate, when given a simulated hazardous materials incident, decon materials and equipment, and an incident action plan, shall decontaminate personnel and equipment leaving the hot zone

- a) entry team personnel
- b) field decontamination of equipment used by entry team

**Note to Evaluator – Either Skill #38 will have to drawn and completed or the evaluators must set up the corridor based on the product in the scenario before Skill #39 can be performed.**

Candidate will ensure that persons coming from hot zone are decontaminated from the entry team member that is the least contaminated to the member that is the most contaminated, and/or from the team member that has the least amount of air to greatest amount of air left in their SCBA.				
Candidate starts decontamination at the head of the entry team member and works down to the feet.				
Candidate keeps over-spray to a minimum.				
Candidate communicates with entry team member to ensure directions are followed and safety is adhered to.				
Candidate moves entry team member from wash pool to rinse pool(s).				
Candidate ensures decontamination process is complete. Any contamination missed first time through is sent back to be washed and rinsed again.				
Candidate ensures cross contamination is at a minimum.				
<b>Candidate properly doff vapor protective suit.</b>				
Candidate removes the SCBA, but the mask stays on.				
The hood is removed and the suit unzipped using the zipper tap.				
The top of the suit should be pulled away from the wearer exposing arms and hands. This should be done without coming in contact with the wearer or the inside of the suit.				
The candidate should loosen the boots and hold the bottom of each leg to allow the wearer to step out of the suit more easily. Boots, suit and SCBA are placed in a receptacle.				
<b>Field decontamination of equipment used by entry team.</b>				
Candidate decontaminates equipment used by the entry team members according to manufacturer's recommendations.

Objective(s): 7.4.2 NFPA Standard 472 2008 Edition

### INSTRUCTIONS TO THE PROCTOR/EVALUATOR

1. Candidate must indicate that they have been instructed how to perform this skill. A negative answer is an immediate failure. No second attempt is allowed. This step doesn't count for the total number of steps the candidate must complete.
2. Candidates can verbalize certain aspects of this skill. Monitoring the area where the corridor is going to be built and said to be safe. Verbalizing that the decontamination corridor is being established uphill, upwind, and out of contact with any product.
3. Evaluator will select either Level 1 or Level 2 Decontamination Corridors for the candidate to complete.
4. Evaluator may use dirt, mud or flour as a contaminant to be decontaminated.
5. Each candidate should have their own chemical protective clothing that will be worn for the decontamination process. Each can take turns as the entry team member to be decontaminated.

**\*Note: If Skill #39 is drawn, Skill #38 will also have to be completed.**
